## ANSWERS TO Catholic I.Q. from pages 16 and 17

- **1. a)** "[T]he Church, endowed with the gifts of her founder and faithfully observing his precepts of charity, humility and self-denial, receives the mission of proclaiming and establishing among all peoples the Kingdom of Christ and of God, and she is on earth the seed and the beginning of that kingdom," (CCC, 768).
- **2. d)** Through being born again of water and the Spirit in Baptism, we are freed from sin, become members of the Body of Christ, and are made sharers in the Church's mission (see *CCC*, 782, 1213).
- c) The Catholic's whole life words and actions — should reflect the love of God and point people to Jesus.
- **4. b)** Jesus said: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20).
- **5. d)** The Catholic community welcomes all people all around the world, making room for the many cultures, races, ethnicities, and local customs of faith.
- **6. False.** As disciples of Christ, Catholics work so that every aspect of life follows God's will: family life, nations, government, entertainment, and all of society.
- **7. d)** St. Teresa of Calcutta explained her ministry to the sick, the helpless, and the dying by saying she was taking care of Jesus in the "distressing disguise of the poor."
- **8. c)** "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16).

- **15. True.** Although she never left her convent, St. Thérèse prayed unceasingly for missionaries all over the world.
- **16. a)** Jesus said: "I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God, because for this purpose I have been sent" (Luke 4:43). And later he said to his disciples: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).
- **17. b)** God created all human persons out of love, so the Church helps everyone without prejudice or distinction.
