**D.** How many Beatitudes are there? \_\_\_\_\_

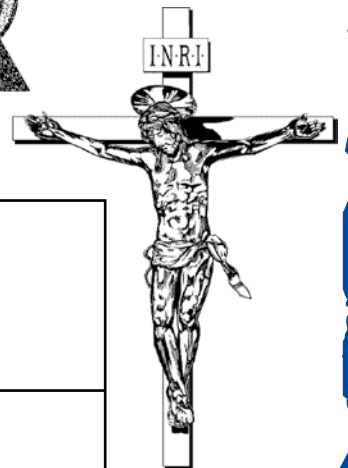
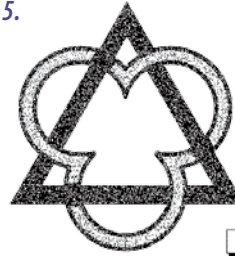

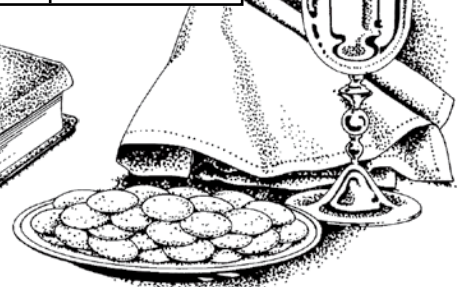
