Answers

1. B) There are a total of four Sundays in the Season of Advent.

2. B) We prepare for the Nativity of Jesus with special prayers, repentance for our sins and going to Confession, and reaching out to help others.

3. D) There are three purple candles and one rose candle on the Advent wreath. We light the rose candle on the Third Sunday of Advent. The rose color represents our joy growing stronger in anticipation of the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus.

4. D) The Immaculate Conception is the dogma that states that Mary was conceived in her mother's womb without the stain of Original Sin.

5. B) The color violet symbolizes preparation; during Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Violet

symbolizes royalty; Jesus is the King of Kings. Violet symbolizes repentance; we seek forgiveness during Advent to help us prepare to truly celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus.

6. B) In the Bible, Luke 2:1-7 tells about this. Find Luke 2:1-7 in your Bible.

7. A) The Season of Christmas ends with the Baptism of Jesus.

8. C) The word *epiphany* means "showing forth" or "revealing." When the magi visited the Christ Child, they showed that Jesus had come for the salvation of all people, not just the Jewish people.

9. C) In the Bible, Luke 2:8-12 tells about this. Find Luke 2:8-12 in your Bible.

10. D) Jesus is God the Son, and Mary is Jesus' mother. And so we celebrate Mary as the Mother of God. January 1 is a holy day of obligation.
