As a young woman Émilie lived with her family in France. She had two older sisters and a younger brother. When Émilie's mother died, they went to live with their grandmother. After the death of an older sister, Émilie felt called to serve God by serving others. She started a home for children who had nowhere to live.

Helped people in need

Émilie went on to work with the poor, the sick, those in prison, and other people who were hurting. She went where she was needed, and the way was sometimes difficult. She was a person of prayer and shared the good news of God's love. Other women joined her and Émilie formed the Sisters of the Immaculate Conception of Castres.

Her work continues

Émilie died of cholera in 1854 after a lifetime of service. Her work continues through the order she founded. The sisters work in schools, hospitals, and communities to benefit people in need. They join with others to make a difference in the lives of the people they serve. The order has spread to 15 countries.

Sign of God's love

At her canonization Mass in 2015, Pope Francis said, She "consecrated her life to God and to the poor, the sick, the imprisoned and the exploited, becoming for them and for all a concrete sign of the Lord's merciful love." Her life reminds us that each of us is called to be a sign of God's love for others by our words and our actions.
