### **MATERIALS NEEDED**

- \* 3 1/2 " x 4 1/2 " Yellow Cardstock
- \* Pinking Shears
- \* 3 1/2" x 1/2" Pink Cardstock
- \* 1" circle Dink
- 1" circle Pink Cardstock
- \* 3 1/2" x 3/8" Aluminum Foil
- ROLO® and Hershey's Kisses
- AdhesiveRibbon
- \* Patron of Students Tag

### WITH THE CLASS

- 1. Trim one short end of the yellow cardstock with pinking sheers (zigzag edge scissors), and score every 1/4" lengthwise. Wrap around ROLO and adhere.
- 2. Next, wrap the pink cardstock at the opposite end, adding the pink circle to cover the exposed end of the ROLO.
