ANSWERS TO Catholic I.Q.

1. **a)** St. Jerome (4th century) translated the Bible from Hebrew (OT) and Greek (NT) into Latin. Every Roman Catholic parish in the world used his translation until 1979.
2. **d)** St. Paul has more books in the Bible than any other writer.
3. **c)** Luke wrote his Gospel about Jesus' life and the Acts of the Apostles as a sequel about the early Church.
4. **b)** There are 46 books in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament.
5. **d)** The prophet Daniel prayed to God even though it was illegal. When the king sentenced him to be eaten by lions, God sent an angel to protect him.
6. **False.** Jesus didn't directly write any portion of the New Testament, even though he is the main character in every book.
7. **d)** More than 5 billion copies of the Bible have been printed and distributed worldwide. The New Testament alone has been translated into 1,521 languages.
8. **c)** Selections from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the New Testament, and the Gospels are normally proclaimed at every Sunday Mass.
9. **a)** Only the Gospels of Matthew (6:9-13) and Luke (11:2-4) include the story of Jesus teaching his disciples how to pray (The Lord's Prayer).
10. **b)** The Book of Revelation describes Christ's triumphal return, the final judgment, and God's creation of a "new heaven and a new earth" (Revelation 21:1).
11. **True.** "It was by the apostolic Tradition that the Church discerned which writings are to be included in the list of the sacred books. This complete list is called the canon of Scripture" (CCC, 120).
12. **a)** Since before Jesus was born, the Jewish people read, studied, and memorized the writings of the Old Testament as their sacred scriptures.
13. **d)** Faith includes more than knowing all the right information about Catholicism; it also requires a relationship of love and friendship with God who is a trustworthy Father (see Matthew 6:25-26).
14. **d)** The Bible is one of the primary ways God speaks to us, teaches us, reveals himself to us, and provides comfort, hope, and guidance for all people.
15. **True.** Referring to Christ, the Gospel of John begins: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1).
16. **a)** Jesus gave the Church the responsibility to teach, pass on, and interpret what God has revealed in both Scripture and Tradition (see CCC, 82).
17. **b)** In addition to saving us from sin and hell so we can go to heaven,

Jesus promised to comfort us in this life and be with us until the end of time (see Matthew 28:20).

18. c) Of all the Old Testament books, the Book of Isaiah foretells the most about Christ speaking about the virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14), and Christ's role as the messiah and suffering servant (see Isaiah 42, 49, 50, 52, 53).

19. a) This trio accompanied Jesus apart from the other 12 on three occasions: the healing of Jairus' daughter (Luke 8:50-55), the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-8), and in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36-39).

20. True. With the Book of Revelation, the canon of Scripture is closed. God continues to speak, however, through the teaching Church (the magisterium), through modern prophets and saints, as well as to individual believers. But all these newer "revelations" must agree with and be consistent with the themes in the canonical Scriptures.

7. **b)** After helping the enslaved Israelites escape from their brutal Egyptian slavemasters, God taught Israel how to live according to his ways through the 10 Commandments and the other Jewish laws.
8. **a)** The people in Noah's day were very wicked, so God decided to start over again. Noah and his family were the only people who survived the floods (Genesis 6-10).
9. **d)** Jesus is described in the Bible as both the "carpenter's son" (Matthew 13:55) and as a carpenter himself (see Mark 6:3). Tradition holds that Joseph died when Jesus was still young.
10. **False.** All Catholics, from children to adults, are encouraged to read the Bible every day so God can speak to them.
