### **ANSWERS TO Catholic I.Q.**

- **1. b)** World Youth Day (WYD) is the largest youth festival in the world, attracting as many as 5 million Catholic youth each time. Many priests, sisters, catechists, and youth ministers say they first heard God's call at the WYD.
- **2. d)** St. John Paul II said at WYD: "Offer your youthful energies and your talents to building a civilization of Christian love." The US Bishops add: "Jesus Christ calls you to follow in his footsteps and make a difference in the world today" (USCCB.org).
- **3. c)** Sin is an offense against God, a rejection of God's love and care for us. When we sin, we say to God: "I am in charge of my life; I decide what is right or wrong, what is good or evil, not you" (see *CCC*, 1850).
- **4. b)** God created us out of the dust of the earth, then breathed life into us (see Genesis 2:7). When our lives end, our relationship with Jesus and how we live will determine what happens next.
- **5. d)** Catholic youth ministry promotes a relationship with Christ, a commitment to live the Gospel, and active engagement in the Church's mission.
- **6. False.** According to the US bishops, authentic youth ministry will "offer young people a spiritually challenging and world-shaping vision that meets their hunger for the chance to participate in a worthy adventure" (USCCB.org).
- **7. d)** God knew Jeremiah from when he was in his mother's womb and promised him that he would speak through him despite his youth (see Jeremiah 1:4-10).
- **8. c)** St. Paul assured Timothy that, despite his youth, he could be a role model for others if he was faithful to Christ.
- **9.** a) Despite predictions that Catholic young people wouldn't be interested in a faith festival with bishops and the Pope, almost one million teens came to Denver to celebrate their faith and their Catholic identity.
- 10. b) Youth ministry addresses the

- catechetical, spiritual, developmental, emotional, social, communal, self-esteem, and service needs of teens.
- **11. False.** Effective youth ministry ensures that every activity includes catechesis that connects Catholic teaching to the lives of the teens.
- **12. a)** "One can never consider self-mastery acquired once and for all. It requires effort at all stages of life. This effort can be more intense ... during childhood and adolescence" (CCC, 2342).
- **13. d)** Youth groups often offer a "Living Stations" during which teens perform a live rendition of Jesus' passion and death.
- **14. d)** Youth ministries must be "multiculturally competent and offer program content that is culturally appropriate and relevant to the needs of participants. Ministry with adolescents helps young people develop their identity by affirming and utilizing the values and traditions of their ethnic cultures" (*Renewing the Vision*; read more at *CATmaq.us/2llObKt*).
- **15. False.** "Ministry with adolescents should not take adolescents away from the family, but rather foster family life. Youth ministry should lead young people into a deeper faith life within their own families" (*Renewing the Vision*).
- **16.** a) Jesus also said of young people: "Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3-4).
- **17. b)** Prayer helps us to see ourselves as God sees us: loved but still attracted to sin. Consistent prayer opens us up to God's help in resisting temptation and sin.
- **18. a)** St. John Bosco devoted his life to serving street kids who often worked in factories under terrible conditions in 19th-century Italy.
- **19. c)** Yom Kippur, also known as the Day of Atonement, is a day of fasting for the Jews.
- **20. True.** The season of Lent invites Catholics to turn away from their sinful habits and return to the Lord for Easter.

- **5. c)** During the Ash Wednesday service at church, Catholics receive blessed ashes on their foreheads. These ashes were made from burnt palms from the previous Palm Sunday.
- **6. c)** Holy Thursday marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the biggest three-day celebration in the Church: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter (see *CCC*, 1168).
- **7. b)** Catholic Lenten practices include almsgiving, which is giving to the poor and those who are suffering. Catholic Relief Services' Rice Bowl is a good example.
- **8.** a) Meat is a luxury for the rich. The poor, in Jesus' time and still today, eat only rice, bread, beans, or vegetables. Giving up meat is a way to connect to the poor who do without luxuries. We can also use the money saved by fasting from meat to help others.
- **9. d)** Fasting is a form of prayerful sacrifice. It also helps us recognize the false things we think will bring us ultimate happiness. Only God fulfills the deepest desires of our hearts.
- **10. True.** Immediately after Jesus was baptized, he went into the desert for 40 days of prayer and fasting. Alone and hungry, the devil tempted Jesus and tried to turn him away from his heavenly Father (see Luke 4:1-15).
