ANSWERS

- **1. d)** Awe and wonder are a natural response to the beauty of God's glory throughout creation. The Holy Spirit helps us recognize that it is God who created all this beauty and that God is awesome.
- 2. a) Truth, beauty, and goodness are called the "transcendentals" because they are the ultimate desires of every person. These desires, which are given to all people by God, transcend every generation and every society.
- 3. c) Through systematic investigation, scientists seek to understand the truths of nature, truths that God created to be discovered (see ((((, 159)).
- 4. b) "Created 'in the image of God,' man expresses the truth of his relationship with the Creator by the beauty of his artistic works ... art bears a certain likeness to God's activity" (CCC, 2501).
- **5.** d) All religions outline a path directed toward a moral life. Christianity teaches Christians how to love the things of God and avoid evil.
- **6.** False. All truth, beauty, and goodness found inside the Church or not — ultimately can be traced back to God since God is the author of everything true, beautiful, and good.
- 7. d) St. Francis wrote: "Be praised, my Lord, for Brother Sun, Sister Moon, Brothers Wind and Air, Sister Water and Brother Fire, for Sister Earth, our Mother. . . . Be praised, my Lord, for our Sister Death."
- 8. c) Physical beauty fades away, but inner beauty lasts for those who are close to the Lord.
- **9.** c) Along with encouraging music, Mother Teresa taught that kindness, a smile, and joy could bring world peace.
- 10. b) The prophet Daniel recognized that all of creation blesses the Lord when it does what God designed it to do.
- 11. True. It delights the Lord to see his creatures doing what he created them to do. People are inspired by nature because they intuit this divine goodness in creation.

- **12.** a) St. Irenaeus taught that God created life, love, beauty, joy, truth, and goodness to be enjoyed and celebrated. Jesus came so that we might have life to the full (see John 10:10).
- 13. d) Just because someone believes something is true doesn't make it true. Only God's truths are true. Christ came so that we would not be confused and mistakenly choose what is wrong or evil (see CCC, 2466).
- **14. d)** Jesus knew that children instinctively recognize beauty, truth, and goodness.
- **15.** False. The opposite is true. Science and technology describe how things work, such as a computer, a car, or our bodies. Religion explains why we are here, why there is evil, or what our purpose in life is. Therefore, religion and science work together to answer life's questions in distinct ways.
- **16.** a) We were created to worship God, who is the source of all truth. Good liturgy with beautiful music, art, ritual, and architecture raise our minds and hearts to the heavens.
- 17. b) Catholicism with its art, music, architecture, incense, bells, ritual, oils, symbols, gestures, dances, and sacraments has always honored our capacity to encounter God through our senses.
- **18.** a) Not every choice is a good one. Catholicism teaches how to avoid self-destructive choices and instead choose God's way of happiness and peace.
- 19. c) St. Paul wrote: "Ever since the creation of the world, [God's] invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity have been able to be understood and perceived in what he has made" (Romans 1:20).
- 20. False. Even though selling them would raise money, the money would run out before all the poor were fed. But the poor could all be fed if rich people and nations would simply share. The Church's art and architecture help people encounter God, which could change their hearts and increase their generosity.
